In the church this year, we have had to help with **self-injury** and **suicide threats**, **mental illness**, **sexual sin**, **domestic conflict**, **abuse**, and **divorce**. We are in a WAR ZONE and are feeling a bit shell-shocked. Your support through prayer is inestimably strategic!
